Houses into Homes is 501c3 nonprofit organization that provides gently-used beds, furniture, and household items for families and individuals in Johnson County who are exiting homelessness, domestic violence, and other crisis situations. Candidates should be enrolled in an undergraduate program in management, communications, nonprofit management, or a related field. This internship provides the opportunity to do work that makes a difference in the lives of hundreds of people every year in the lowa City area and hone project management, outreach and networking, problem solving, and community engagement skills. The intern will work with a collaborative team of 8 employees and numerous dedicated volunteers. The internship is 6-15 hours per week.
